Speakers

Dr. Dan Loy is a university professor in animal science at lowa State University and director of the Iowa Beef Center. He has also served as an extension beef specialist for lowa since 1982, giving leadership to ISU's program to the cattle feeding industry. His research interests have focused on applied feedlot nutrition and beef production and management systems. He is also an instructor for an advanced beef systems management course and a popular quest lecturer. Dan has a B.S. from Western Illinois University and a Ph.D. from Penn State.

Dr. Miranda Meehan is an associate professor in the North Dakota State University animal science department and the NDSU extension livestock environmental stewardship specialist. The focus of her research and extension program is livestock and environmental interactions. Her current research focuses include integrated crop livestock systems, riparian ecology, brine spill remediation and reclamation. Current extension programs focus on reclamation, grazing management, livestock water quality and integrated crop livestock systems. In 2020, she also took on the role as the extension disaster coordinator and has led NDSU Extension's drought, blizzard and avian influenza response efforts. In 2021, Miranda was appointed co-section chief of the drought recovery section of the North Dakota Unified Command.

Dr. Mary Drewnoski is a beef systems specialist with the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Prior to joining UNL in 2014, she spent time learning and working in cattle systems in many locations across the U.S. including Kentucky, North Carolina, Iowa, and Idaho. She is a beef cattle nutritionist with expertise in forage production systems.
